Legend of Michigan Theatre Jackson Michigan: The Michigan Theatre, the last and largest theatre built in downtown Jackson, opened April 30, 1930. The building's exotic Spanish style, lavish interior plasterwork, terra cotta facade, carved walnut furniture, plush carpeting, heavy damask draperies, stained glass light fixtures, and oil paintings entertained the patrons as much as the attractions on the stage and screens. It was the first air conditioned building in downtown Jackson and offered a place to escape the summer heat.

Legend of Jackson Michigan downtown: This view of downtown Jackson shows Michigan Avenue. City Hall is on the right, and the Jackson County Building on the left. In the foreground is the Millenium Clock Tower, that was dedicated on Dec. 31, 1999. The clock tower contains a time capsule, scheduled to be opened in the year 3000. Jackson Michigan was founded in the year 1821, and was named after Democratic President Andrew Jackson, but is also known as being the birthplace of the Republican Party. Jackson is the county seat of Jackson County Michigan.

The Cascades are the result of one man's dream to do something for the people of Jackson -- to build an attraction that would provide visitors with a positive impression of the city. That man was William Sparks. Sparks moved to Jackson from England in 1882 at the age of nine. Sparks was elected to 3 terms as Jackson's mayor. He also organized the Zouaves, a famous drill team that performed throughout the world, and it was during a visit to Spain that he formed the idea for the Cascades from a fountain he saw there. Visitors from all points of the globe came to Jackson to view the falls.
